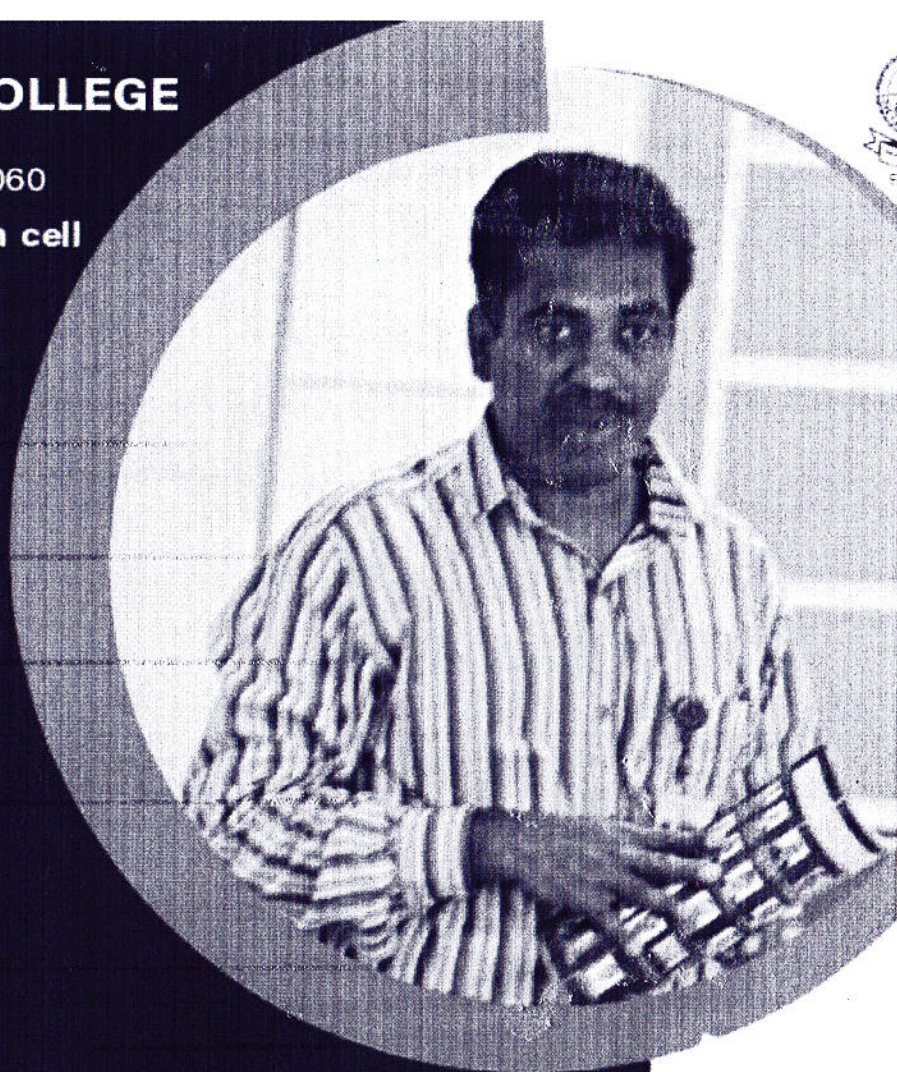

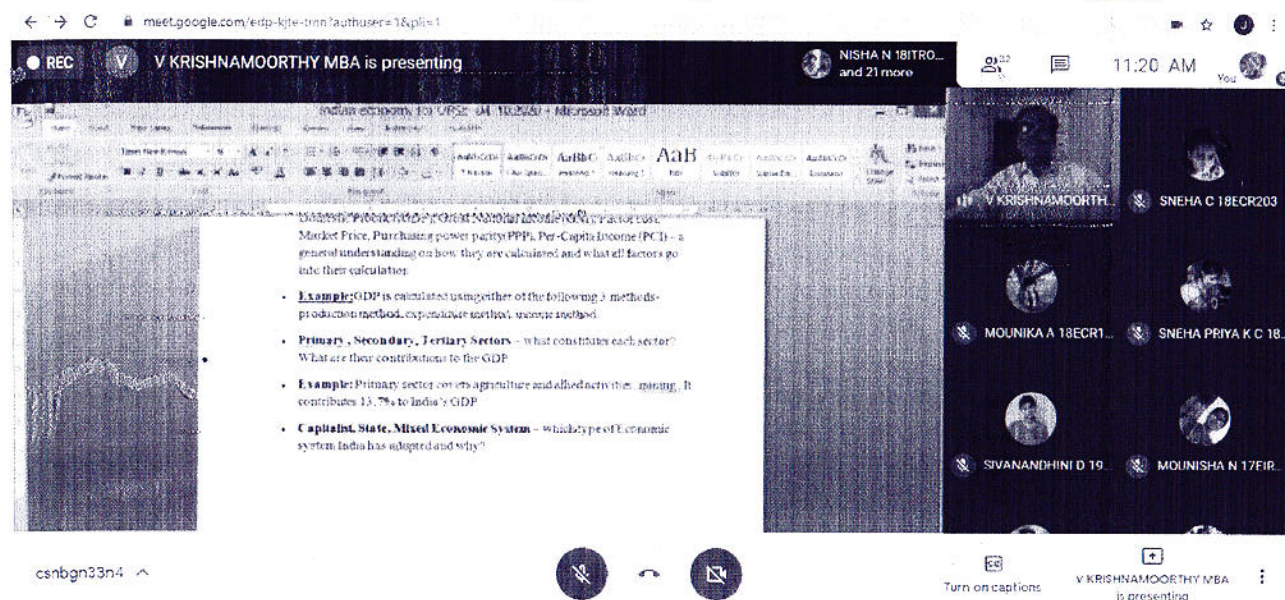
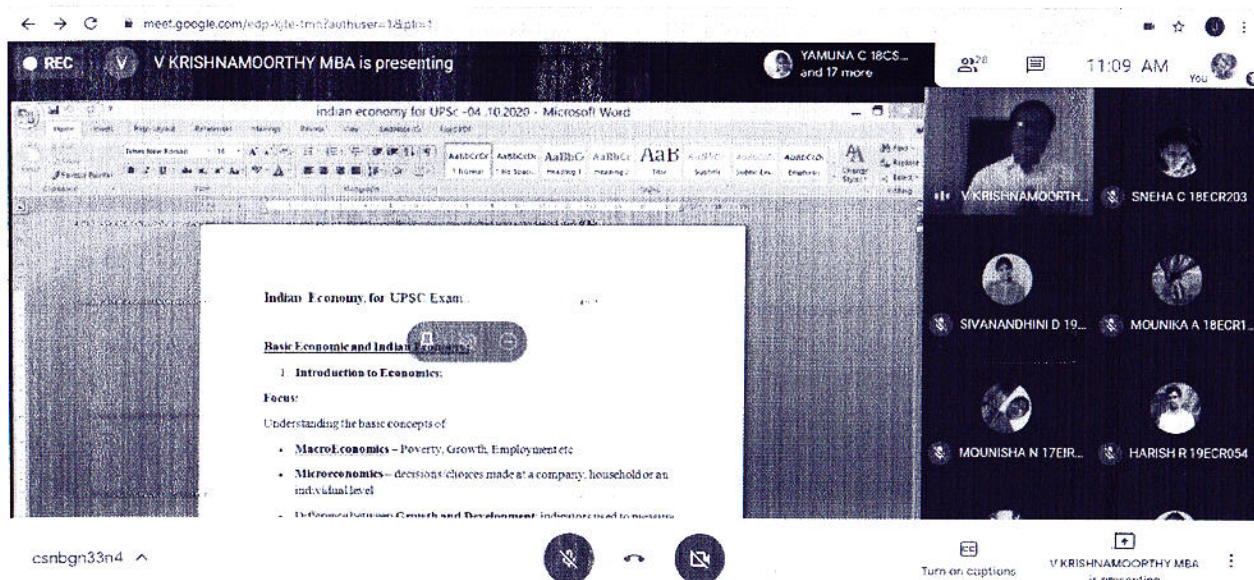

Focus:

- **Poverty** - concepts like Below Poverty line (BPL), Poverty Gap, Poverty estimated by National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO), which Institution in India decides on Poverty line- Planning Commission
- **Different Committee set up** to measure poverty, methodology used - Alag committee, Lakshmi Committee, Planning Commission, NC Sharma Committee, Rangarajan Committee, and understanding of how each committee differed in their recommendations
- **Example Rangarajan**: Committee was set up by Planning Commission in 2012. Methodology used is 'Monthly Expenditure of Family of Five'. According to the estimates - poverty per day per person in urban area is 47 Rs and in rural area it is 32 Rs
- **Inequality** - how is it measured - Gini coefficient, Lorenz Curve, concepts like relative inequality, absolute inequality
- **Issues with employment** - different types of unemployment like disguised

GDP: Gross National Product (GNP) is the total value of the goods and services produced by a country's citizens or companies in one year irrespective of their geographic location.

NDP: Net Domestic Product: $NDP = GDP - Depreciation$

Depreciation: A decrease in the value of an asset over time due to wear and tear.

Monetary Policy: Process by which the central bank in a country controls the supply of money. In India, the central bank is the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).

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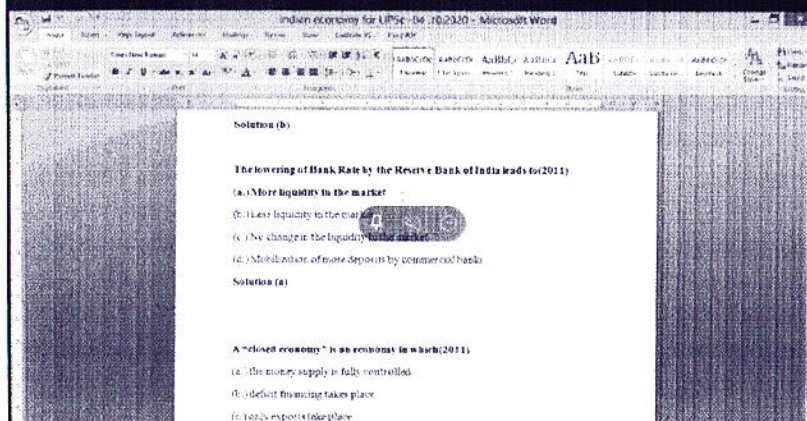

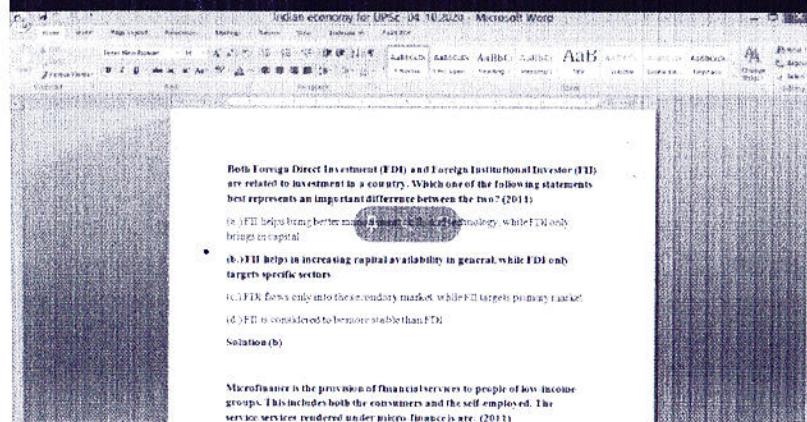
